## CELEBRATING NATIONAL FOOD SAFETY WEEK IN KURUNEGALA

The Kurunegala Municpal council celebrated the "National Food Safety Week" from 17th to 22rd of October 2008, to highlight the importance of food safety and basic principles of food hygiene.

For this, the H800 evaluation criteria that has been used from 2007 to evaluate hotels and restaurants, was further developed by Mr.W.M.P.P Weerasinghe (PHI KMC) into an evaluation that looks into 108 factors including Location and Environment and waste disposal methods etc..

After obtaining the approval for the changes made to the evaluation by the Ministry of Health, the MOH office of the Kurunegala Municipal Council together with the PHI officers began visiting the hotels and restaurants within Kurunegala city for the evaluating t. The evaluated business places were awarded grades based on the points they received in the evaluaA (100-90%) - extremely satisfactory B (89-80%) - satisfactory C (79-60%) - good D (59-1%)-Unsatisfactory



A ceremony was held on 29th October at the Municipal council conference hall, to give away boards displaying the Grades achieved by hotels and restaurants under the categories A & B . the boards were sponsored by the WASPA project and the occasion was graced by his lordship the Mayor of Kurunegala, District Administrator of PHIs Kurunegala, Mr. Kamal Munasignhe, Mr. Sumith Bandara, Mr. Weerasinghe CPHI and many other distinguish guests.

Dr. Gavani Dassanavake urged all hotels and restaurants that received grades A and B to keep up their best practices and also to upgrade them as much as possible, the MOH office has the power to take away the grade, as the hotels and restaurants will be monitored continuously. Moreover she said that business places that have received both C and D grades will be given a 2 month grace period to upgrade their practices, where if not found satisfactory will be addressed by taking legal action against them.

Kurunegala consists of members representing all the stakeholders of the project; including Local government departments, agencies, Traders, Hoteliers and Vehicle service station owners associations as well as NGOs and Community based organizations.

The 3 visions of WASPA along with the set of Participatory Action Plans (PAPs) were also developed with the involvement of the LA members.

#### A SEED PADDY PRODUCERS GROUP IN WILGODA AMUNA FARMER ORGANIZATION

Under the WASPA project, a seed paddy producers' committee was established as a group

within the "Wilgoda amuna" farmers' organization with the support of provincial Department of Agriculture and agrarian service center. A revolving fund was established to obtain high quality seed paddy when necessary and to keep the sustainability of this committee.

The first distribution of the Certified Seed Paddy from the Department of Agriculture was held on November 3rd with the presence



of Deputy Director Mr. O.P. Kithsiri (Provincial DOA), Assistant Director Mr. Seelarathne (Provincial DOA), Agriculture Instructor Mr. Wijesinshe and Mr.Jayasundarsa (Provincial DOA) Miss Nalifa Mr baseem and Miss.Pushpa (Agriculture Research) & Promotion Assistants).

Further more, as a result of the onsite demonstration on the 15th of October in making charcoal, a silicon rich natal fertilizer using Paddy husks, 8 more charcoal making units (barrels) were distributed for three yaya according to the farmers population under the supervision of AR&PA. The units were sponsored by WASPA



Moreover, as further assistance to the livelihood development of the farmers, seeds for "Nivara wagawa" (weir cultivation) such as Maize, Me etc. was also distribute among the farmers by Agriculture Research & Promotion Assistants.The seeds were

As further encouragement to the participants of the SWM programme, WASPA together with the PS, provided Cement made permanent compost bins on the 18th of September 2008. He also expressed that the PS is now planning to scale up this SWM programme taking Wilgodawatte as the model area.

The participants contributed 25% of the cost for the bins where the rest was added by WASPA Programme.

Imagine life without a toilet. No toilets in your home or at work, no public toilets, no toilets anywhere, Imagine the mess, Imagine the disease.

It's hard to imagine life without something we take for granted, but this is the daily reality for 2.6 billion people -40% of the world's population.

Without toilets disease and death are

rife. Illness prevents people from working and stops children going to school. Teenage girls are too embarrassed to go to school without latrines and teachers won't work in them.

- 2.6 billion people do not have somewhere safe, private or hygienic to go to the toilet.
- One gram of faeces can contain 10 million viruses, one million bacteria, 1000 parasite cysts and 100 parasite eggs.
- The simple act of washing hands with soap and water after going to the toilet can reduce diarrhoeal diseases by over

Safe disposal of children's faeces leads to a reduction of nearly 40% in childhood diarrhoea.






### DISPLAY BOARDS TO PREVENT WATER POLLUTION
