## Safe reuse of wastewater and treated excreta in agriculture: Options, assessments and potential barriers for fulfilment

## Objectives:

The objective of the workshop is to present and discuss wastewater, greywater and excreta management and agricultural use. The perspectives of the technical and non-technical options for risk reduction will be presented and discussed, as well as the nutritional benefits with the re-use. This will compare with the "WHO Guidelines for the Safe Use of Excreta, Greywater and Wastewater in Agriculture" and with the current management options as related to barriers to disease transmission as well as with different sanitation system solutions, including dry toilets.

The second objective is to discuss holistic planning in this field, and the potential for other fields, through the concept of networks or Learning Alliances.
